All our sponsor children have a personal sponsor and will be able to go to school next years. CIMD tries to give them all the chances; we organize extra lessons. If possible, we send them to a better school. Each child we accompany individual. If they have problems we look for a solution together. But they have to be motivated, go to school and receive the best possible results. They have to do it, we just help. At least every month they have to have contact with their sponsor; it doesn't hurt to say 'Thank you very much for your help'.



But sometimes it goes wrong; parents don't want to send their daughter to school with the only reason that it is a girl. Or brings itself in problems. Or a child gives up. In those cases, we become extra active; we don't give up just like that. Maybe, sometimes we believe it ourselves, we go too far in this but we also think that it is already difficult enough for these children; parents who don't care what happens to their child, orphans or abandoned children. One of them, Nengah, tells about her experience.

Nengah tells her story:



Hello everybody, I'm Nengah Juliantini,

I'm from Amed. I want to tell about my experience before I meet with Foundation CIMD.

Around 5 years ago after I finished Junior High School, I went to Denpasar to work because my family can't paid if I went to school again.

In Denpasar I had studied sew with my aunt during a few months because my cousin gave me information about job vacancy

And I tried that job, I got job in Air force canteen. They gave me Rp.300.000 a month (25 Euro). I had to wake up early in morning, at 04.00 am, for prepare all. I had two friends, they from Java. They show to me what must I do. And at 05.30 am we went to the canteen by foot around 30 minutes from house. In canteen we prepare foods, cleaned, and so on. At 07.00 am the Army came for had breakfast, some time I brought the order to the Army office. The canteen opened until 16.00 pm, and we came back to the house. In the house I had to cleaned, and my friends prepare the material for tomorrow, and if I was finished cleaned I helped in kitchen again. After all finished we could take rest. I got food three time a day, we do it every day. My boss also except food order, when foods order came we work extra hard. Around two months I worked over there I felt not strong to do the job. And when I met with some students on the way to school I felt sad because I want like them, and went to school, had a lot of friends and can get science. When I felt tired I always cried and angry with myself and I want came back to my house. After few months, my brother called me from house. He said that I maybe could go to school. Because in my village was foundation wanted to help in school. And I said yes. So my brother asked with head community for help en talked with head foundation about me. Every day I always waited my brother gave me information about that. Next day my brother called me and he said that the foundation did not helped start in senior high school. I felt disappointed about that. I felt did not had enable to school again. And that was made me not spirit to work again. And I said with my boss that I wanted back to house, but my boss did not permit. So I tried to stand, but I can only one month worked it. After that I came back to my house and I asked about the foundation. My brother told what the program of foundation. And a few weeks I stayed in house I felt boring and I met with my friends, they always talked about their school, it's made me sad and felt hate to hear that. On Sunday my friends invited me to follow to the English course in foundation, but I felt shy and my friends supported me, and I wanted to come. First time I felt nervous and the teacher asked me to introduce my self. I followed the course every week. And a few weeks, my head community came to my house and he said that the foundation asked me and they offered me to helped them in foundation, and he said maybe I got enable to school again. So I was happy and I except to helped with sponsor children during a few month and they wanted to help me to school again. Finally I went to school although I already stopped to school during two years. And on 2011/2012 academic year I was passing in senior high school.

Now I help in Foundation CIMD and study my English.

You will be charmed and fascinated by the natural beauty of Bali and its hospitality.

We will make every effort to give our guests the most comfortable and unforgettable holiday ever in this tropical paradise. Do you know what INDAH actually means? Eden, Paradise, Shangri-la... A name to live up to. Suitable for 6 persons. The villa has a large living room on the ground floor, an open kitchen, separate toilet, storage room with washing machine and drier and two bedrooms, each with its own open bathroom with shower and toilet. On the first floor there is a third bedroom with a separate bathroom, shower and toilet and a sitting area with TV. There is a large balcony terrace with a comfortable Balinese sofa. Enjoy from here the breath-taking view over the Bali Sea and if you are lucky, you see dolphins swimming by. All rooms have large cupboards and silent air-conditioning. There is a large terrace with dining table and two lounge sofas. Adjoining you'll find a swimming pool (5 x 12 m) with comfortable deck chairs. The beach, with its fine lava sand, is near to the villa. We have a little beach house with lots of soft cushions (bale begong) near the sea. In the evening, it is a nice place for watching the spectacular sunset over the isle of Java. Six days a week (8 hours a day) our Balinese staff is at your service to clean the house and keep the garden. Ironing, washing and cooking may be arranged on request... They also do your shopping. You only have to pay the ingredients for the meals. There is also a varied menu with Balinese, Indonesian and European dishes. Of course you are free to cook your own meals. The daily living in Bali is not expensive. The staff is unobtrusive and discreet and respects your privacy. It is customary in Bali that the villa is watched by security at night. In case of any further questions don't hesitate to contact the service desk. If you wish to make an excursion, we will arrange you a car with driver (6 persons).
